4. Announcement of New Moderator

Megan Price was pleased to announce that the Revd David Salsbury had been nominated to serve as the Moderator of National Synod of Wales and he had accepted that nomination. He then spoke to the meeting.

5. Emergency Resolution on Israel and Palestine

Resolution X was proposed by Jo Harris and passed unanimously

Resolution X:

The United Reformed Church National Synod of Wales expresses concern and condemns all acts of violence and retaliation. We stand for peace and unity and pray for the victims of the attacks in Israel and Palestinian - victims caught in the violent crossfire of retaliation. We echo the words of our Christian siblings – The Patriarchs and Heads of churches in Jerusalem:

As custodians of the Christian faith, deeply rooted in the Holy Land, we stand in solidarity with the people of this region, who are enduring the devastating consequences of continued strife. Our faith, which is founded on the teachings of Jesus Christ, compels us to advocate for the cessation of all violent and military activities that bring harm to both Palestinian and Israeli civilians...

It is our fervent hope and prayer that all parties involved will heed this call for an immediate cessation of violence. We implore political leaders and authorities to engage in sincere dialogue, seeking lasting solution that promote justice, peace, and reconciliation for the people of this land, who have endured the burdens of conflict for far too long.

10. General Assembly

Megan Price explained about the visit to General Assembly (GA) this year. 16 people from the Synod attended, and there will be a video produced to explain what goes on for the benefit of churches to understand the process.

Next year's GA will be held at The Hayes conference Centre in Derbyshire from 12-15 July 2024. In Appendix G of the Meeting Papers is a nomination form for Moderator of General Assembly.

11. Church Life Review

Megan Price outlined the Church Life Review which was created by Mission Council and resulted in the THEOS booklet that was circulated to all churches earlier in the year. Penrhys was one church that was used as an example in the review. From this review came several papers to GA including Safer Recruitment and others. A PLATO book is available to help with templates. Resource sharing is to be encouraged both locally and nationally. There is an acceptance that Lay work is now needed even more to relieve the load on Ministers of The Word and Sacraments in our churches.

12. Children and Young People - events and resources

Judy Harris announced that there are Advent resources available.

Holiday club resources will be available from January 2024

Youth Assembly was noted, it was important in helping young people feel less isolated. URC Children are holding 2 events in Cardiff and Swansea. They are fun days with circus skills, games, food and cake.

Diana advised churches that if they are in need of any help in regard to safeguarding, to contact her. Various issues such as mental health, cost of living, NHS may be challenging but she can highlight training to help deal with these. Mental Health First Aid training is available from Judy Harris.

13. Eco Synod update

Eileen Newington was pleased that the National Synod of Wales had been achieved the Bronze Award. This has been attained through a lot of hard work throughout the Synod. The Synod Office had achieved a Silver Award. Eileen was grateful to Claire Boot, Chris Atherton and Judy Harris for all their help in working for these awards. The Bronze Award has also been achieved by City URC, Cwmbran URC and Dan Y Graig, Risca. A single-use plastic ban is coming in to force soon and churches need to check their cupboards and store rooms for these and ensure they are discarded or used before 30th October 2023.
