### 3. <u>Minutes of the Autumn 2023 Synod Meeting at the Hotel Metropole, Llandrindod Wells</u>

The minutes of the meeting held at the Metropole Hotel, Llandrindod Wells, on Saturday 15 October 2022 were approved without amendment and signed as a true record.

#### 4. Stepwise Update

Jason Askew gave a report on the Stepwise sessions noting postive feedback and growth.

#### 5. Lay Worship Ministry Update

Stephen Best reported on the new guidance for Lay Worship Ministry. It highlights the different routes available to Lay people into Ministry.

#### 6. Whole People of God

Jason Askew introduced the user friendly leaflets and work sheets soon to be to churches.

#### 7. Reaching Net Zero by 2030

Eileen Newington reported on commitments to meet Net Zero by 2030. Comments on the resolution were received.

Jo Harris felt the resolution didn't go far enough in encouraging churches to meet Net Zero before 2030.

Chris Atherton proposed the following addition:

"Synod Meeting requests that all Synod Boards and Committees direct their energies and resources available to them to achieve Net Zero targets that are set as a result of the Environmental Policy." This was unanimously agreed.

Resolution 1, including the addition, was passed with no objections:

#### **Resolution 1**

Synod Meeting notes the United Reformed Church Environmental Policy 2022 and supports the reduction of carbon emissions across the whole of church life, with the aim of reaching net zero emissions of greenhouse gases by 2030. Synod Meeting requests that all Synod Boards and Committees direct their energies and resources available to them to achieve Net Zero targets that are set as a result of the Environmental Policy. It commends the Environmental Policy to churches for their consideration and action (Resolution 17b General Assembly 2022). The United Reformed Church Synod of Wales Environmental Policy will be updated inline with the 2030 target.

#### 8. Mission and Development Fund

Claire Boot introduced the resolution, noting that the increase would recognise the increased cost of green improvements and would inspire churches to be as environmentally concious in their building works.

Chris Atherton stated that it would be a demonstration of support from the denomination which would be well received by external funding bodies.

The resolution was passed with one vote against.

#### **Resolution 3**

Synod Meeting resolves to include carbon emission reduction and Eco Church participation in the application criteria for Mission Development Fund grants, to increase the development grant to £10,000 and to increase the main grant to £40,000.

#### 9. Synod Ecumenical Strategy

Martin Spain presented the Ecumenical Strategy for the Synod of Wales.

The need to recognise what takes place locally and empower churches to take the next step was noted.

#### 10. Quest Spaces in Church

Youth Representative, Nathaniel Stinton was welcomed, he reported on the resolution.

The resolution was passed with no objections:

#### **Resolution 3:**

In line with the More Able Church initiative, the National Synod of Wales Youth Representative, strongly encourages churches to introduce a quiet space for people to use when they feel overwhelmed. The National Synod of Wales Youth Representative also urges churches to make the space accessible to help people of all ages with engagement in worship.

#### 11. Hearing Children's Voices (0-12 years old)

Judy Harris reported on ways of hearing childrens voices and engaging them on decision making.

Finding ways to improve communication with young people, taking their concerns and views seriously was stressed. Resources to help churches do this are available from Children and Youth Work or the Synod of Wales Children and Youth Development Officer (CYDO).

### Conversations regarding eco-church, reaching Net Zero by 2030 and changes to the Mission and Development Fund

- Solar panels are expensive, how do we get environmental value?
- How can we encourage our members to be greener at home and not just in church.
- How does increasing the MDF application help reaching Net Zero?
- Making simple changes and encouraging meaningful participation in measuring carbon footprints.
- The importance of our communities seeing that we are taking environmental concerns seriously and how from the perspective of mission is it helpful to show that we are taking action.
- Air source heat pumps can be expensive and noisy.
- Continuing to heat buildings whilst consiering the daunting prospect of complying with a very small Net Zero time frame.
- Warmer Spaces is a clear link between a mission project and good/upgraded heating systems.
- Making sure that MDF criteria are not too onerous and that churches feel encouraged and supported in their applications.

#### **Conversations regarding Quiet Spaces**

- The difficulty in finding quiet spaces with some church arcitecture.
- Cytun provided a quiet space in their tent at the Royal Welsh Show last year.
- Providing activity bags that themselves aren't distracting.
- Having a low volume speaker so people in a quiet space could still feel like they're part of the service.
- The need to pastorally consider those using a quiet space.
- Some work places have quiet spaces, so churches should be able to accommodate this.
